EDUCATION ACTION PLAN

By championing programs that enhance early childhood development, support academic achievement and promote career readiness, we aim to empower individuals to thrive academically and professionally. Through strategic partnerships and targeted investments, we are committed to building a brighter future where every learner can reach their full potential.



Big Brothers Big Sisters

United Way of Reno County supports the One-to-One Mentoring program, which served 76 youth in Reno County last year.



Boys and Girls Club

United Way of Reno County funds the Boys and Girls Club programming, which is designed with Academic Success, Good Character & Citizenship and Healthy Lifestyle Outcomes in mind. Last year, BGC Hutchinson served 1,438 youth in Reno County.



Child Care Links

United Way of Reno County helps fund scholarships to cover the cost of daycare for families facing financial challenges. Last year, Child Care Links provided scholarships to 23 families.



Early Education Center

United Way of Reno County allocates funds to the Infant and Toddler program which is aimed at helping infants and toddlers in Reno County with special needs or who are at risk for developmental delays. Last year, the program served 1,009 children.



Hadley Day Care

United Way of Reno County supports childcare at Hadley Day Care, offering services to families of all income levels with a sliding-scale based tuition. Last year, they served 150 children.



Hutchinson Public Schools Childcare Center

United Way of Reno County supports the USD 308 Childcare Center, which serves infants and toddlers in Reno County. Last year, they cared for 37 children.

Dolly Parton Imagination Library

United Way funds support the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program, which provides free, high quality, age-appropriate books to any child age 0 to 5 living in Reno County every month. Last year, 2846 local children received books from the Imagination Library.

Early Childhood Block Grant

UWRC received a FY25 grant to enhance early childhood services for at-risk children from birth to kindergarten in Reno County schools, childcare centers, and family support agencies. The grant fosters a public/private partnership for high-quality, accessible, affordable programs.

ARPA Childcare Grant in partnership with the Reno County Childcare Task Force

The Childcare Task Force has been guiding the utilization of ARPA Childcare funds and UWRC is the fiscal agent for distributing funds in the community. In 2024-2025, a projected \$1.5M - \$2.5M in grants will be distributed to address childcare needs in our Reno County community.

HEALTH ACTION PLAN

In our commitment to focus on the health of our community, UWRC is steadfast in promoting access to essential healthcare services, mental wellness support and initiatives that foster overall well-being.

By partnering with healthcare providers, community organizations, and advocates, we strive to address healthcare disparities, enhance preventive care and improve health outcomes for individuals and families across our region. Through collaborative efforts and targeted investments, we are dedicated to creating a healthier and more resilient community where everyone can thrive.



BrightHouse

United Way provides support for Advocacy and Shelter Services, the Parenting Time Center and Community Awareness initiatives. Last year, the Shelter served 555 individuals and provided Parenting Time Services to 275 people. BrightHouse also provided education to 1,734 people in our community about domestic violence.



Cerebral Palsy Research Foundation

United Way provides funding for the CPRF Wheelchair Clinic & Equipment Fund. Last year, this organization helped 60 individuals in Reno County by providing custom wheelchair systems or assisting with medical equipmentases.hases.



Horizons Mental Health Center

United Way of Reno County supports Child Advocacy and Prevention Services at Horizons. Last year, 1,103 individuals were served through Prevention services and 300 individuals were served through intervention services. Additionally, UWRC supported Community Training and Education efforts. Horizons was able to reach 4,461 people through training efforts last year.



Hospice and Homecare of Reno County

United Way of Reno County funds the Hospice House and the Children's Bereavement program. Last year, the Hospice House provided end-of-life care to 218 individuals at a reduced cost. This organization also supported 41 children that lost a loved one through their summertime "Space to Grieve" camp.



Hutchinson YMCA

United Way provides funds for Membership Financial Assistance, Will Power Hour, and Saturday Night at the Y. Through the Financial Assistance Program, the YMCA was able to help 500 people receive partial funding for their membership. Last year, 40 people benefitted from the FREE Will Power Hour and 450 youth were served during Saturday Night at the Y events.



Kansas Children's Service League

United Way supports the Healthy Families initiative, a program focused on the prevention of child abuse and neglect. Last year, the program served 123 family members in Reno County.



Hutchinson Meals on Wheels

United Way funds the Meals on Wheels program, which provides hot, nutritious meals 5 days a week to individuals that are unable to prepare their own meals, including elderly, disabled, and homebound community members. Last year, the program served 250 people.



Rise Up Reno Prevention Network

United Way provides support for the Drug Prevention program and the Reno County Suicide Prevention Coalition. The Drug Prevention program reached 106,112 individuals in Reno County last year and the Suicide Prevention Coalition reached 13,545 individuals.

United Way's SingleCare Discount Prescription Drug program is a lifeline for many in our community, ensuring individuals can afford the medication they need.



The Delta Dental Program is a collaboration between Delta Dental of Kansas (DDKS) and United Way of Reno County. This program is dedicated to extending dental benefits to qualifying individuals who may otherwise lack access to quality care.



United Way has invested in a new mental and emotional support tool for residents to access for FREE! This 24/7 online service allows community members to chat with caring, trained volunteers, explore self help guides and growth paths for proven tips and advice on how to feel better.

FINANCIAL STABILITY ACTION PLAN

United Way is committed to empowering individuals and families through initiatives that promote economic independence and financial resilience. By collaborating with local partners and stakeholders, UWRC aims to provide access to essential resources, financial education, and workforce development opportunities. Through strategic investments and advocacy efforts, we strive to create pathways to economic stability and prosperity for all members of our community.



Circles of Hope Reno County

United Way supports the the Circles of Hope program, which connects people in supportive relationships across income levels and helps people who are economically vulnerable develop clear goals and develop specific plans in order to impact their future story. Last year, the program served 28 individuals and families.



Interfaith Housing and Community Services

United Way funds the Lighthouse, a program that houses and provides numerous supports to 18-25 year-olds experiencing housing insecurities. Last year, the Lighthouse served 13 young adults. UWRC also supports the Take Control Program, which helps families and individuals grow their financial wellness. This program helped 192 people last year. The Kansas IDA Program and the Home Repair and Rehabilitation Program at Interfaith are the final programs backed by UWRC helping individuals to purchase a home as well as address home repairs for low income and elderly persons. These programs served 27 and 162 people, respectively.



Kansas Legal Services

United Way supports the work of Kansas Legal Services, which is the sole poverty law firm in Kansas. Last year, they served 99 individuals in Reno County, which included help with immediate, intermediate, and long-term counsel on cases ranging from domestic violence situations to landlord-tenant conflict.



New Beginnings Inc.

United Way provides support for NOEL Lodge Emergency Shelter, which offers emergency shelter to individuals and families who are homeless. The NOEL Lodge offers all clients dinner, laundry facilities, bathroom and shower amenities, breakfast and job search/internet access in a safe environment. Last year, the shelter served 308 individuals.





The Salvation Army

United Way supports the Emergency Assistance Program which aids residents of Reno County who are facing momentary crisis situations cover living costs. Last year, the program helped 5,869 individuals.

The Volunteer Center of Reno County

United Way provides funding for the Volunteer Center volunteer program, Friends in Action Companionship and Shopping programs and the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program-providing free tax preparation for low to moderate income households. Last year, 1,022 individuals volunteered in Reno County in some capacity, 44 Reno County residents were served through the Friends in Action efforts as well as 1,562 individuals were helped with tax preparation-resulting in more than a \$1M federal refund dollars coming back to Reno County.








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
